Above and Beyond Make your own edible endothermic reaction • With adult help, make your own sherbet (https://fun-science.org.uk/funscience-how-to-make-sherbet/) • Test the sherbet and note any observations. Does your mouth feel colder? • Research why sherbet feels cold when you eat it.

Option 1 Define what an endothermic and exothermic reaction are. Write some examples of each type of reaction

Above and Beyond: Research into the development of culture in WEimar Germany and create a PowerPoint presentation on the topic. Include the development of Art, Literature, Theatre, Music and Film.
