The Brilliant Club at Kenton School

In January a scheme aimed at encouraging students with the potential to attend top universities started at Kenton. Over 40 Year 8 and 9 students applied for just 15 places with Mr Taylor having the difficult task of selecting the students. The 15 students have been receiving tutorials led by a University PhD lecturer on the STEM topic: Can scientists save the world? which investigates antibiotics, how they are made and issues around resistance. Alongside this Ms Leach and Mr Taylor have designed a bespoke Elective Curriculum option that provides the students with scientific based experiences they would not normally have until

KS4 or even Sixth Form. This has included Sessions on emergency First Aid including CPR, Growing of bacteria from around the school and Even the dissection of a lambs heart. In addition to these Mr Bell, ex Head of Sixth Form and Quiz Master, has been running a fortnightly quiz league developing students general knowledge. All this is Focused on providing students with the belief and confidence to attend elite universities.
