Above and Beyond: Research a Buddhist charity and what they do to try and look after the world.

Option One- Comic strip about the life of Siddartha.

Computer Studies: Data Representation

Above and Beyond: Make a presentation that uses animations to show how to add two binary numbers together. Your presentation should outline the rules for binary addition.

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Science: Pressure

Above and Beyond: Ice safety! Research how to safely rescue someone who has fallen through ice on a lake. Explain the equipment used and how it works in terms of forces and pressure.

Option 1 Draw a cartoon strip to show what happens when you pump up a balloon. Show what is happening to the particles and to the pressure. Explain why it eventually pops.

History: Jack the Ripper

French: Mon Identité

Above and Beyond: Create a family tree of your family in French with one fact about each person eg job or where they live.

Option 1: Log onto Languagenut and complete the tasks which have been set for you

Drama: Theatre in Education

Above and Beyond: Write the first act of a script which tackles a current issue, such as bullying, racism or social media, using the theatre conventions of TIE.
